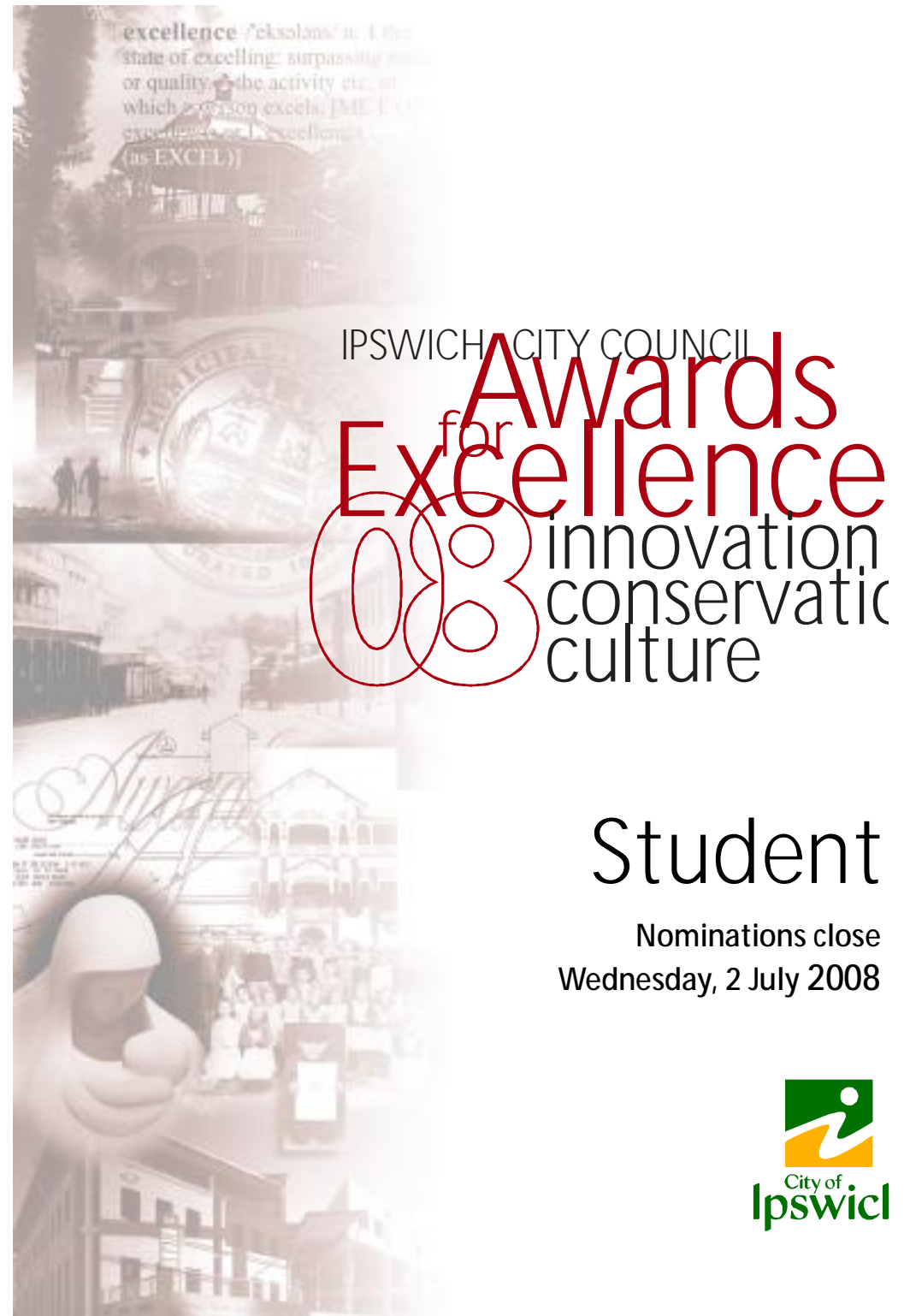

#### PRESENTATION OF THE AWARDS:

On Tuesday, 19 August 2008 awards in the form of certificates will be presented on the recommendation of the Judging Panel, to the person(s) principally responsible for the project/works.

#### STUDENT AWARD CATEGORIES:

The Awards are intended to encourage students from Early Childhood, Lower Primary, Middle School(Grades 5-9), Upper High School(Grades 10-12) and Tertiary Level to carry out research or implement programs which promote the lifestyle, culture, environment or heritage of the City of Ipswich.

Nominated Projects may include:

- Heritage Trails
- History of the School or a local area
- Environmental projects
- Research papers
- Web sites or Power Point presentations

Students are encouraged to nominate for the following:

- Young Environmental Volunteer of the Year: recognising a young persons (ages 10-25) commitment/participation to/in environmental projects in Ipswich through a community group, school or individually.
- Green Schools Commitment Award: for environmental work including educational/awareness programs, on-ground works and clean ups.

- The Cr Paul Tully Heritage Chairperson Award for Best Website: This award acknowledges the work of individuals and groups to promote history of Ipswich through web sites. You can nominate a website (either own or a site you have been viewing) to receive the award.

#### ATTACHMENTS:

Student input for creation of the information submitted is essential. A summary providing an explanation of the project from the student's perspective should be included in the nomination.

#### JUDGING CRITERIA:

Nominations are judged on general academic principles. The judges would like to know what knowledge the students gained through the project and the skill acquired. The following criteria is used to judge the Student Awards:

- Does the project have academic merit, i.e. does it relate to the curriculum of the relevant grade?
- Has the student/s shown an understanding of the topic that they have selected?
- Does the project exhibit innovation?
- Has documentary evidence been collected to support the project?
