## Coming Soon! HOME ENERGY EFFICIENCY KITS

Ipswich Libraries members will soon be able to borrow kits that make it easy to assess the efficiency of your home.

- Power consumption, running costs and greenhouse gas emissions
- Hot and cold spots in your home that can be improved
- If your fridge, freezer, heating, cooling and hot water systems are running at optimal temperatures
- Flow rate from any water outlet

TRIALLING NEW
TRANSPORT TECHNOLOGY

Springfield residents are the first in Ipswich to trial e-scooter hire as part of a six-month trial.

E-scooter hire company Beam is delivering the pilot program with Ipswich City Council using a fleet of safety-focused e-scooters in Springfield Central, Springfield Lakes and Spring Mountain.

The Beam e-scooters feature geo-locking technology ensures the scooters remain out of high pedestrian zones and maximum speeds are limited.

The e-scooter trial will allow residents to try out shared e-scooters and provide council with guidance on the future of the technology.

### **E-SCOOTER SAFETY AND ETIQUETTE**

- Riders must be at least 16 years old, or 12 with adult supervision
- Limit your speed to 12km/h on footpaths and keep to the left
- Wear an approved bicycle helmet that is securely fitted
- Don't use a mobile phone while riding
- Park in a safe location leaving a clear pathway

# BE LIKE THE JONESES

Reducing Ipswich waste to landfill is simple - and starts at home.

Meet the Jones family! Through some simple actions, the Joneses are making a big difference to the amount of waste their household sends to landfill.



### **FANTASTIC AT FOGO**

The Jones family opted-in to council's green waste kerbside collection service for their garden clippings and now take advantage of the full food organics garden organics (FOGO) service.

- After each meal the Joneses scrape their plates and bowls directly into a kitchen caddy. All the food scraps go in – including meat, dairy, bones and more!
- The Joneses store their caddy in the fridge until bin collection day, to reduce any smells. Then, once it's been emptied into the kerbside bin, they wash it with warm soapy water.
- Their FOGO bin is collected fortnightly by council and the organic material is mulched and turned into compost at a local composting facility.

### **RED-HOT AT RECYCLING**

By keeping it simple, the Joneses are preventing contamination in their yellow-lid recycling bin.

- The Jones family always check first that items of paper, plastic, cardboard, tin or glass are suitable for the yellow lid bin.
- By giving containers such as milk bottles a quick rinse before putting in the recycling bin, the Jones family reduce spills and smells.
- All the recyclable items go in a large easy-to-access container, then the Joneses just empty it straight into the yellow lid kerbside bin – no plastic bags!

# HOW MUCH WASTE CAN WE SAVE?


Small changes at home can have a big impact at the amount of waste our city sends to landfill.

On average, an Ipswich household generates 1 tonne of waste and recyclable material each year.

- By 2050 we have to divert 95% of our city's waste from landfill
- By 2050 we have to increase recycling of our city's waste by 70%

There is much opportunity for diverting waste from landfill, just sitting in our red lid bins!

For example, here is a typical lpswich household red lid bin. Almost half of its content could be diverted from landfill today.



### **COMPOSTABLE ORGANICS (35%)**

These can be diverted from landfill by going into an opt-in FOGO bin. Capturing and composting organic waste also greatly reduces emissions from landfill.

### **CO-MINGLED RECYCLABLES (19%)**

These could be easily diverted from landfill through the yellow lid recycling bin.

### **RESIDUAL WASTE (46%)**

This is the leftover waste that is not suitable for kerbside recycling or organics.


