HERE ARE THE TOP 5
ITEMS THAT CAN GO IN
YOUR RECYCLING BIN

- Glass jars and bottles
- 2 Aluminium and steel cans and tins
- 3 Plastic bottles and containers
- Cardboard boxes
- 5 Paper including magazines

REMEMBER TO KEEP IT LOOSE! It might seem convenient to bundle your recycling into a plastic bag - but that will end up going straight to landfill.

Keep your recycling loose and make sure no soft plastics such as plastic bags end up in there.

HAVE YOU BOOKED YOUR FREE FLEXISKIP?





Ipswich households can book a FREE large item kerbside collection each year with FLEXiSKiP.

FLEXISKIP is a heavy duty, 2 cubic metre skip bag. It's big enough to fit couches, mattresses, washing machines, bikes and other large items.

With this on-demand model a minimum of 50 per cent of materials collected will be recovered from landfill, and with the new bagged system there will be less chance of litter and debris left on the kerbside.
