City of Ipswich **Division 3 Snapshot** 2021 Census



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This profile provides a 'point-in-time' snapshot on a range of Census topics relating to the residents who live in Division 3 and the City of Ipswich Local Government Area (LGA). This report draws on ABS Census 2021 and 2016 data for Division 3 and uses City of Ipswich as the benchmark.

Suburb data reported in this profile is sourced from ABS QuickStats. Small areas and/or major amendments to boundaries may affect data reported in this profile (e.g. suburb trend data).

It should be noted that, for the purposes of this analysis and to show impact, where suburbs have been referenced specifically, information and statistics about these suburbs have been summarised in their entirety (not just the component falling within the division).

DIVISION 3 Profile




LOCATION AND BOUNDARIES

Division 3 contains many of the central Ipswich suburbs. It is oriented in a west-east direction with Brisbane Road and the Ipswich train line through its core. In the western extent is Leichhardt and One Mile, with the northern extent of the division largely bound by the Bremer and Brisbane Rivers. The southern boundary follows Bundamba Creek north of Blackstone, the Cunningham Highway and Redbank Plains Road. The eastern extent is bordered by Goodna Creek, the Ipswich Motorway and Stuart Street.

Division 3 is a geographic catchment of 6,848ha (68km²).

As suburbs within Division 3 are mostly well-established, population growth is expected to be stable, and much slower compared to new development areas of lpswich.

The division includes Ipswich's CBD and the suburbs of One Mile, Leichhardt, Coalfalls, Sadliers Crossing, West Ipswich, Woodend, Ipswich, Basin Pocket, East Ipswich, Newtown, Eastern Heights, Silkstone, Booval, North Booval, Bundamba, Ebbw Vale, New Chum, Dinmore, Riverview and Collingwood Park. It also includes a part of Wulkuraka that lies south of the railway line, most of Redbank excluding those houses situated east of Kruger Parade and the part of Goodna that falls west of Stuart Street.

SUBURBAN DEMOGRAPHICS

As Division 3 comprises many well-established suburbs, it also comprises a diversity of age groups, socioeconomic groups and cultures within its boundaries.

At the 2021 Census, Division 3 had an older median age relative to the City of Ipswich (36 years compared to 33 years). The Division 3 suburbs of Ipswich, Ebbw Vale, Booval and Eastern heights had an average age above this (45 years, 43 years, 43 years and 45 years respectively), while the youngest average age was in Redbank (30 years) and Collingwood Park and Leichhardt (31 years).

Coalfalls, Collingwood Park and Newtown are the only Division 3 suburbs to have a median weekly household income above the city average (\$1,731, \$1,755, and \$1,753 respectively, compared to \$1,637 for the City of Ipswich).

Division 3 encompasses most of the locality of Redbank and a small part of the localities of Goodna and Wulkuraka.

Table 1 shows data has been provided from ABS census profile. The Division 3 population total in Table 1 is derived from the total of all suburb populations.

Table 2 presents the median age of suburb residents between 2016 and 2021. Suburb data for both census periods are reported for completeness and consistency across all divisional profiles. Overall the average age of residents has increased between 2016 and 2021. The average age of residents in all suburbs, except Basin Pocket and Silkstone, have increased by 1-6 years. Suburbs where the median age dropped include Dinmore and Ebbw Vale (-3 years), Redbank (-5 years), and Riverview and Woodend (-1 year).

Some suburbs within Division 3 showed an increase in population between 2016 and 2021. Collingwood Park and Redbank continues to experience growth associated with new developments resulting in an additional 2,142 and 1,097 people respectively. Leichhardt and Silkstone also saw small growth in an additional 559 people and 350 people respectively.

Increases in the average household income between 2016 and 2021 has been most notable in Newtown, Coalfalls, Dinmore and Redbank. While the suburb of West Ipswich saw minimal change.

POPULATION AND GENDER



In the 2021 Census, the total resident population for Division 3 was 57,219. Of these, 28,191 were male and 29,028 were female (representing a 49.3% and 50.7% respective split).

Note: For the 2021 census the ABS advises that this variable records each person's sex. A person's sex is based on their sex characteristics, such as their chromosomes, hormones and reproductive organs. If sex is not stated it is imputed.



In 2021, the largest age group in Division 3 was 25 to 29 year olds. The group that changed the most since 2016 was 10 to 14 year olds, increasing by 939 people.

In 2021, Division 3 had a larger proportion of the population aged 35 to 49 years (19.3% of the population). Figure 2 shows how the demographic is changing with growth in young and working-aged families.

HOUSEHOLD STRUCTURE

In Division 3, 24.0% of households were made up of couples with children in 2021, compared with 32.6% in the City of Ipswich.

The division's household and family structure is one of the most important demographic indicators. It reveals the area's residential role and function, era of settlement and provides key insights into the level of demand for services and facilities as most are related to age and household types.




ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER PEOPLES

In 2021, 18.7% of people in Division 3 were born overseas, compared with 21.7% in the City of Ipswich.


The largest non-english speaking country of birth in Division 3 was Philippines, where 1.3% of the population were born.




Figure 4. Division 3 residents, top 20 countries of birth other than Australia in 2021



LANGUAGE SPOKEN AT HOME





In Division 3, there 6,482 people (11.3%) who spoke a language other than English at home in 2021. There are 64 languages other than English spoken by Division 3 residents.

The dominant language spoken at home, other than English, in Division3 was Samoan, with 2.3% or 1,304 people speaking this language at home.




Figure 6. Top 15 languages, other than English, spoken at home in Division 3 from 2021

NEED FOR ASSISTANCE




In Division 3, there were 5,092 people (or 9.0% of residents across all age groups who responded needing assistance) that reported needing help in their day-to-day lives due to a 'profound or severe core activity limitation'.

Day-to-day core activities are defined as including self-care, body movement and communication that are reported as limited because of a disability, long-term health condition, or old age.

Note: A person's reported need for assistance in the Census is a subjective assessment. As such, this data should be treated with caution.

Figure 8. Division 3 residents who participated in voluntary work in 2016 and 2021





Figure 9. City of Ipswich and Division 3 proportion of residents' volunteer participation in 2021

Figure 10. Division 3 top 10 religions ranked by size, 2021





Figure 11. Residents' religious affiliations in Division 3 and City of Ipswich in 2021

In 2021, 39.5% of residents attended an education institute with the highest proportion of education attendance of 8.8% for primary school aged residents.




Figure 12. City of Ipswich and Division 3 residents enrolled in education, 2016 and 2021





Figure 13. Division 3 residents' highest year of secondary school completed in 2021 and 2016






Division 3 in 2021, shows that there was a higher proportion of people that held qualifications with 46.3%.

EMPLOYMENT




Division 3 had 39,448 residents who are working aged, with 23,419 residents in the labour force (or 57.0%, below the average participation rate for the City of Ipswich, 62.6%).

Of the Division 3 labour force:

- 13,889 persons worked full-time (54.1%)
- 7,173 persons worked part-time (27.9%)
- 2,357 persons were employed, away from work (9.2%)
- 2,262 were unemployed (8.8%). Of these residents, 1,429 were seeking full time work and 833 stated they were seeking part-time work.

Figure 16. Division 3, number of employed and unemployed looking for work in 2021






INDUSTRY



In 2021, the top five employment industries for working residents of Division 3 were: Healthcare and social assistance (15.7%), Retail trade (10.4%), Manufacturing (9.6%), Education and training (8.1%) and Construction (7.6%).

Figure 17. Industries of employment for workers in Division 3 and the City of Ipswich, 2016 and 2021






Figure 18. Division 3 workers by industry of employment, 2021

- Community and Personal Service Workers (14.2%).





Figure 19. Occupation groups for residents of Division 3 and the City of Ipswich, 2021

METHOD OF TRAVEL TO WORK



There were 1,673 working residents in Division 3 who caught public transport to work in 2021 (4.5%), while 16,086 working residents (68.7%) used a private vehicle.

Figure 21. Number of working residents by method of travel to work Division 3, 2021




Figure 22. Method of travel to work, Division 3 and the City of Ipswich, 2021

INCOME



In Division 3, 5.5% of the population earned an income of 2,000 or more per week in 2021.

Dissection of the total personal income by quartiles in 2021 showed that of Division 3 population aged 15 years and over:

- 11,286 (or 27.3%) were in the lowest quartile earning less than \$388 weekly
- 1,965 (or 28.9%) were in the medium lowest quartile earning \$389 to \$786 per week
- 11,180 (or 27.0%) were in the medium highest quartile earning \$787 to \$1,424 per week
- 6,961 (or 16.8%) were in the highest personal income quartile earning \$1,425 and over.




Figure 23. Individual weekly income of Division 3 residents aged 15 years and over in 2021

In 2021, 40.8% of Division 3 households earned a weekly income above \$1,500.

Division 3 had the following household incomes dissection in 2021:

- 6,044 households were in the lowest quartile earning less than \$853 per week
- 5,933 households (30.1%) were in the 'medium lowest' quartile earning between \$854 to \$1,665
- 4,816 households (24.4%) were in the 'medium highest' quartile earning \$1,666 to \$2,791
- 2,909 households (14.8%) were in the highest quartile, earning \$2,792 and over.




Figure 25. Division 3, households total weekly income in 2021



HOUSING TENURE



In 2021, 51.5% of households in Division 3 had purchased or fully owned their home and 34.6% were renting privately, with another 6.0% in social housing.


CAR OWNERSHIP



Analysis of car ownership in 2021, indicates 48.0% of households in Division 3 had access to two or more motor vehicles, compared to 57.0% in the City of Ipswich.

There were still 1,851 households (8.3%) in Division 3 that did not have access to a motor vehicle.
