INTRODUCTION:

This is a report by the Community Grants Officer dated 31 January 2018 concerning the allocation of Community Development Grants Program funds.

BACKGROUND:

Council's Community Grants Scheme includes a Community Development Grants Program with a budget allocation of \$140,000.00 (which includes an allocation of \$40,000.00 for Christmas events and activities) for the 2017–2018 financial year.

Applications are accepted throughout the year for Community Development Grants and allocated against a monthly budget of approximately \$8,300.00, with any residual rolled over to the next month.

Successful applicants must be able to demonstrate a community development framework that enhances the community life and wellbeing of Ipswich residents. The maximum grant available for community groups is \$2,500.00.

GRANT APPLICATIONS RECEIVED:

Council received two eligible applications this month.

1. Kruger Parade Baptist Church

Kruger Parade Baptist Church seeks funding towards the annual Community Easter Festival, to be held at the Kruger Baptist Church grounds, Redbank.

The community surrounding Kruger Parade Baptist Church includes many families from diverse multicultural backgrounds, and families on low incomes who are unable to attend events in neighbouring suburbs due to financial and transport constraints. The Community Easter Festival is a free, family friendly event which attracts approximately 1,000 people each year and includes free rides, entertainment and a sausage sizzle for participants.

Kruger Parade Baptist Church provides information at the event, about various outreach programs available to the wider community.

The total cost of the event is \$5,144.00 (excl-GST) and it is recommended that Council allocate \$2,500.00 (excl-GST) to Kruger Parade Baptist Church towards the outdoor stage, sound hire, and entertainment costs.

2. Renegade Bowmen Inc

Renegade Bowmen Inc is based in South Ripley and has over 250 members within the Club who participate in the sport of Archery.

Renegade Bowmen Inc (the Club) seeks funding towards building a retaining wall and safety fence at their practice range in South Ripley. The practice range requires widening to accommodate more archers and will replace a temporary barrier.

The Club undertakes monthly coaching sessions open to the wider community and due to the popularity of the sessions, are restricted with space within the practice range. The construction of a retaining wall will enhance safety within the area. The long term impact of the project will improve the Club's ability to host national and international events. Currently Renegade Bowmen Inc are applying to host the Pacific Regional Archery Competition in 2018. If successful the event will draw 300 participants to Ipswich for the duration of the competition.

The total cost of constructing the retaining wall is \$3,501.00 (incl-GST) and, in line with Council's policy that projects for improvements to community infrastructure are eligible for 50% of the total cost of the project up to a maximum of \$1,250.00, it is recommended that Council allocate \$1,250.00 (incl-GST) to Renegade Bowmen Inc towards costs associated with the project.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

Approval of the Community Development Grants in this report of \$3,750.00 will leave a balance of \$75,805.93 available for allocation during the remainder of the 2017–2018 financial year.

INTRODUCTION:

This is a report by the Community Grants Officer dated 31 January 2018 concerning the Regional Arts Development Fund (RADF) Grants for Funding Round 1, 2017-2018

BACKGROUND:

Arts Queensland provided funding matched dollar-for-dollar with the Ipswich City Council in the 2017–2018 financial year to support the development of the Ipswich Arts and Cultural Strategy and grant funding for applications approved by the Ipswich RADF Committee.

Grant applications are assessed by the RADF Assessment Committee for two funding rounds each financial year, in addition to provision for individual professional development applications assessed as Quick Response Grants.

RADF ASSESSMENT MEETING

Applications for funding through RADF closed on 31 December. Nine (9) applications were received and the recommendation from the RADF Assessment Committee to Ipswich City Council is that two (2) applicants, be funded as outlined below.

Museum and Gallery Services Queensland Ltd

Museums and Galleries Queensland Ltd (M&G Qld - peak body for museums and galleries in Queensland), has sought funding through RADF to undertake a Standards Review Program (the Program) in Ipswich to work with local participating organisations including RAAF Amberley Aviation Heritage Centre, Ipswich Grammar School Archives and Museum, Ipswich Soldiers Memorial Hall Museum, Ipswich Hospital Museum and Ipswich Historical Society.

The objective of the program is to engage museum and gallery professionals to work with M&G Qld on developing participants' museum practice. This voluntary program will assist participating museums and galleries to improve their practice, raise their profile, develop future planning and strengthen community networks. The program will also assist participants to develop skills in the three key areas of museum practice identified in the National Standards for Australian Museums and Galleries:

- Managing the Museum
- Involving People
- Developing a Significant Collection

The total cost of the program is \$91,815 and Museums and Galleries Queensland Ltd has requested \$10,840 towards the program costs.

Circus Ipswich

Circus Ipswich Inc has sought funding through RADF to pilot circus skills workshops for children with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD).

Circus Ipswich will collaborate with occupational therapists and experts in the field of ASD to deliver a 10 week workshop series in Ipswich for up to 15 children. The project will also undertake professional development for circus trainers to run ongoing workshops for children with ASD, and develop a plan and partnerships with local business and other community groups to sustain ongoing workshops.

The total cost of the project is \$15,060 and Circus Ipswich has requested \$7,600 towards the program costs.

Following Council's approval of the recommendations, applicants will be advised of the outcome of their application. Each of the grants will support cultural projects to a value of \$106,875.00.

BENEFITS TO COMMUNITY AND CUSTOMERS:

Implementation of the RADF Grants form part of Council's support for the community and is consistent with Advance Ipswich, and the Corporate Plan 2017–2022. Projects are required to contribute to one or more of the following funding objectives:

- Encourage community activities that promote and celebrate a sense of belonging.
- Engage the community in the creation of local projects and programs that encourage inclusion and participation and promote and demonstrate a sense of belonging as it relates to the whole of community.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

Funding for the provision of RADF grants, promotion, community engagement and RADF Committee training is provided in the Community Engagement budget. A total of \$86,768.10 is available for distribution for the 2017–2018 financial year as follows:
