### Major Projects and Initiatives

#### **Budget Overview**

More money than ever before will be invested in roads, bridges and community facilities under Ipswich City Council's 2017-2018 Budget.

The environment is another big winner with funding for conservation estates, supporting koala and platypus populations and promoting sustainability through popular community events.

A bumper line-up of arts, cultural and heritage programs will also be delivered.

Highlights include more than \$1.1 million for the development of the Fernbrooke sports fields and money for installing new and replacement kerb and channel at four roads in Redbank Plains.

Council's commitment to the environment sees \$110,000 allocated for improving fences and creek crossings at White Rock – Spring Mountain Conservation Estate, which spans divisions 9 and 3.
