BIRDING IN IPSWICH

Almost 300 bird species (approx. 47% of Queensland's avifauna), have been identified in Ipswich. A full list can be obtained via the Birds of Ipswich booklet, available from Ipswich City Council libraries and the Queens Park Environmental Centre.

A few iconic Ipswich species: Apostlebirds in Chuwar (Horton Drive) and parts of Karalee; Black-necked Stork at local dams and wetlands in the south and south-west rural and semi-rural areas; Grey-crowned Babblers in the guiet side roads of Ironbark.

Look out for birds while in the Ipswich CBD: Southern Boobook, Mistletoebird, Superb Fairywren, Double-barred Finch, Australian Owletnightjars, Bush Stone-Curlew, Eastern Spinebill*, may be seen/heard in the Ipswich CBD and fringing suburbs. Hundreds of Scaly-breasted Lorikeets roost in the trees on upper Brisbane St every night.

Site Notes

Where UBD references are not applicable, a reference to the local mapping directory known as the Downs-Lockyer Roads and Street Map is provided (D*L). Species lists were compiled using data from eBird.org and cross-checked by local birders. They follow the taxonomic ordering system as per IOC v 8.1. Migratory or nomadic species are marked with an * and can be seen on a seasonal basis.

Sites with access for mobility impaired vary in terms of which Sites with access for mobility impaired i.e., sections are accessible. In general, meeting points and picnic areas are what is meant by accessible. Some have paved or concreted paths. however this is rare

Off-road parking may include a designated car parking area or the availability of off roadside verge parking. Care should be taken when parking on verges adjacent to busy roads.







30. Evelyn Dodds Cultural Reserve

The Black Leg Gully in Castle Hill Blackstone Reserve is a little farther along Mary St. Grey Teal, Australasian Grebe, Nankeen Night-heron, Great Egret, Intermediate Egret, Australasian Darter, Dusky Moorhen, Peaceful Dove, Pheasant Coucal, Pacific Koel*, Oriental Dollarbird*, Blue-faced Honeyeater, Yellow-faced Honeyeater*, Blue-faced Honeyeater, White-throated Gerygone, Golden Whistler*, Olive-backed Oriole, Doublebarred Finch.

31. Bundamba Creek. Bundamba

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256 Brisbane Rd, Bundamba UBD 214 F14 -27.6105, 152.8024 Park with riparian revegetation, grassland, parkland and mature eucalypts along Bundamba Creek. Park behind Bundamba Swim Centre, follow the sealed paths along Bundamba Creek through Jack Barkley Park to Gledson St, and return. Brown Quail, Straw-necked Ibis, Great Egret, Black Kite, Dusky Moorhen, Channel-billed Cuckoo*, Oriental Dollarbird*, Azure Kingfisher, Nankeen Kestrel, Little Corella, Little Lorikeet, Striped Honeyeater, Little Friarbird, White-browed Scrubwren, Olive-backed Oriole, Tree Martin, Tawny Grassbird, Golden-headed Cisticola, Mistletoebird, Plum-headed Finch, Chestnut-breasted Mannikin.

32. Ric Nattrass Environmental Park


