

## How to FOGO like a pro

#### Food scraps container:

- Place your food scraps and leftovers into a container.
- You can use a kitchen caddy, an empty ice cream container or an old Tupperware container.
- Keep your container handy on your kitchen bench, under the sink, in the fridge, or the freezer.
- Ensure that your food scraps container is kept closed and empty the contents regularly into your FOGO bin.
- You can freeze your food scraps like seafood or meat bones until collection day.
- Empty takeaway foods or out-of-date pantry foods into your food scraps container or directly into your FOGO bin.
- Wash out your food scraps container as needed.

#### Your FOGO bin:

- Where possible, position the FOGO bin in the shade.
- Put some small branches in your bin first and cover food scraps with dry leaves. This will help reduce odour and absorb liquids.
- Hose out your FOGO bin as needed

### What is FOGO?

FOGO stands for Food Organics and Garden Organics. FOGO (formerly known as Green Waste) is a paid kerbside bin service where you can dispose of food scraps and garden waste for less than 25 cents per day.

The organic waste is collected fortnightly and turned into compost at a local composting facility. This compost is then used to improve soil quality and grow more food – closing the loop on organic waste in lpswich.



It's important that you only put organic and compostable items in the FOGO bin. Inorganic material such as plastic, metal and glass can cause serious issues in the composting process and affect the quality of the compost. ## Why FOGO?

Did you know that in Ipswich last year almost 30% or 15,500 tonnes of all General Waste (red bin) material was organic matter suitable for composting?


In landfill food and garden waste create harmful greenhouse gases.

**Please Note:** Bins cannot exceed 50kg. If you can't move it, the truck can't lift it.
