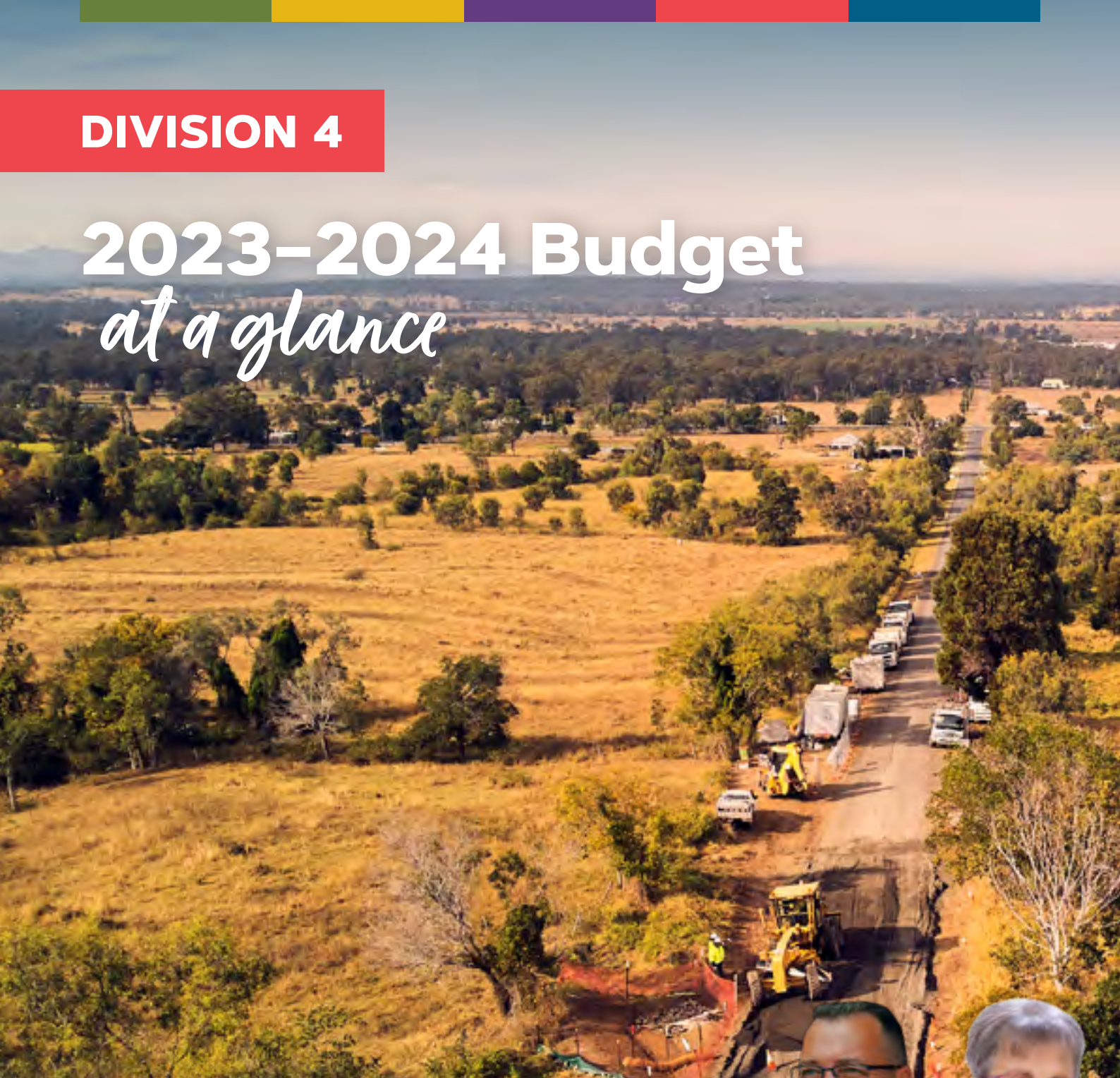

DIVISION 4 BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

Lifting the standard of local roads across Division 4 is a key focus in Ipswich City Council's 2023–2024 Budget.

Ipswich City Council has delivered a measured, responsible budget with a rate rise under inflation amid major economic pressures.

Deputy Mayor and Division 4 Councillor Russell Milligan said important upgrades would be delivered at Blackwood Avenue, North Ipswich and Adelong Avenue, Thagoona.

"A major focus for Division 4 in the 2023–2024 financial year will be lifting the standard of several local roads, which will bring immediate benefit for motorists and the local community," Deputy Mayor Milligan said.

"Several gravel roads have been scheduled for improvement, and important kerb and channel projects will be delivered."

Division 4 Councillor Kate Kunzelmann said community facilities would also be enhanced with lighting upgrades at Sutton Park and along the Brassall Bikeway.

"The important environmental work along Ironpot Creek at Pine Mountain is also continuing with the next stage of works funded," Cr Kunzelmann said.

"Flood mitigation will also be improved through works at Parcell and Holt streets at Brassall and Arthur Summervilles Road at Karalee.

"We would like to thank our State and Federal government partners for funding contributions to some of the above projects."

This year's budget includes a critical \$267.2 million investment in capital works with a \$75 million commitment to flood recovery projects and more than \$70 million to deliver quality waste recovery programs for the community.
