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What is a Corporate Plan?

The Corporate Plan is a roadmap of what council will work towards over the next five years (2021 –2026). It will outline council's key work activities, the responsible areas of Council, and expected outcomes. The new Corporate Plan will include a community vision and outline council's contribution and role in achieving the vision.

Council is required to have a 5-year Corporate Plan that incorporates community engagement under Section 104 of the *Local Government Act 2009*.









What is a Community Vision?

A community vision is an agreement of what everyone wants the community to look like in the future. The vision usually spans over a 20 to 25-year time frame and is a shared commitment between everyone who lives, works, and plays in the community.

The current Community Plan, Advanced Ipswich, will be repealed when the new Corporate Plan including community vision commences as it is no longer legislated to have this document.

The new Corporate Plan will improve Council's strategic and operational planning, because:


- The community profile has changed since the community vision was developed in 2015,
