PENALTIES APPLY



Passenger Loading Zones allow you to stop for **up to two minutes** to pick up or drop off a passenger.

A driver must not stop or park for **longer than indicated in a loading zone. Loading zones are in place to ensure a high turnover of vehicles can utilise the loading zone to drop off or collect children.** The driver should stay in the vehicle where possible.



A driver **must not stop** where a no stopping sign or yellow 'no stopping' line applies. Drop off and picking up is not allowed **at any time.**

Vehicles **can not stop** from 7.00 am to 9.00 am, and 2.00 pm to 4.00 pm on school days.

Unless you are driving a bus (seating more than 12 people) **you must not stop within a bus zone at any time.**

This zone is only available to buses.

ROAD SAFETY AROUND SCHOOLS

Parking Patrols

Council uses automatic number plate recognition technology for parking enforcement. This technology is fitted on a patrolling vehicle and enables Council to monitor parking around schools. If a vehicle is found parking contrary to the Queensland Road Rules, an infringement notice will be issued to the vehicle owner by post.



Loading Zone Do's and Don'ts

DO

- ✓ Use the zone like a quick moving taxi rank.
- ✓ Move to the head of the queue or move forward as space becomes available.
- ✓ Teach children to move promptly to the vehicle.
- ✓ Load and unload passengers at the front of the line.
- ✓ Stay in the car if you are the driver, unless loading or unloading baggage or passengers.

DON'T

- ✗ Park for more than two minutes - you can be fined for this.
- ✗ Double park.
- ✗ Leave the vehicle, except to load or unload.
- ✗ Queue through pedestrian crossings, round-a-bouts or in no stopping zones - it's illegal and dangerous.

Parking on the nature strip, verge or footpath is illegal

Vehicles driving across footpaths and nature strips create a higher risk of collision with pedestrians, especially small children who are harder to see.



Don't double park

Making children navigate between parked cars is extremely dangerous.

Don't put their lives at risk!
